US files dispute against India on solar cells and solar modules

The United States notified the WTO secretariat of a request for consultations with India concerning certain measures relating to domestic content requirement for solar cells and solar modules. These measures are corresponding to Phase II of the Jawaharlal Nehru National Solar Mission programme, in India.

This programme had been adopted by India for the promotion of solar power generation facilities.

As per United States, India requires solar power developers to purchase and use solar cells and solar modules of domestic origin.

The United States, adds that solar power developers receive certain benefits and advantages, such as long term tariff for electricity, contingent on their purchase and use of solar cells and solar modules of domestic origin. Thus, according to United States, India provides less favorable treatment to imported solar cells and solar modules.

The U.S. Department of Labor announced a \$1.2M grant to provide training and other services to about 175 workers affected by layoffs by two manufacturing and lighting companies located in USA. The ability to obtain jobs after a lay-off takes an investment for gaining specialized skills after years in workforce. This federal grant will provide the requisite training to these workers who would be looking for new occupations.

The grant, awarded will provide assistance to these workers with the training and supportive services which they will receive as a result of their eligibility for Trade Adjustment Assistance benefits.
